

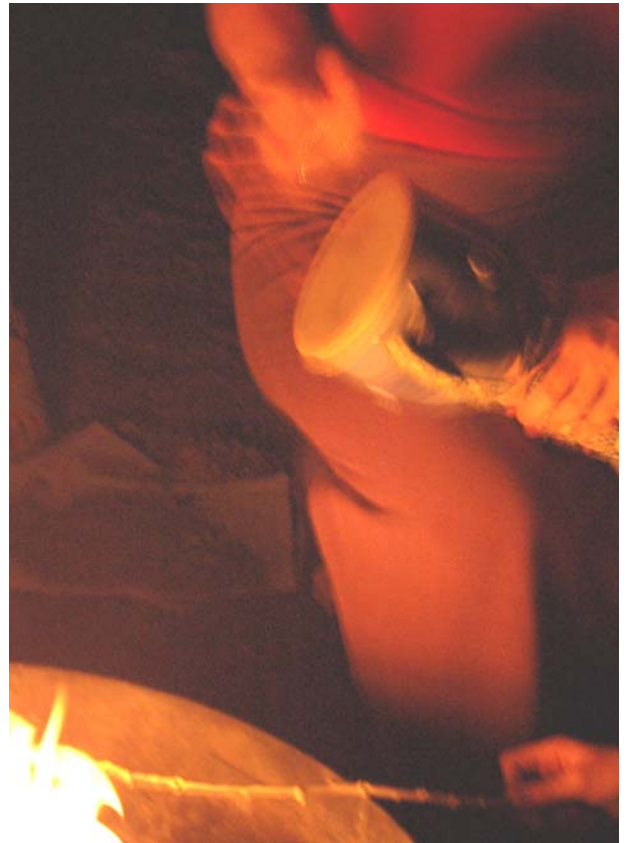
MeadowFest

WELCOME to MeadowFest

PLEASE REGISTER EARLY:

- ❖ Fill Out "Registration Form", sign "Release & Indemnity", and mail form with check to address on form.
- ❖ Questions? Email rain@trigoddess.org or Call Sára: (970)227-5275

CHECK-IN: Campers and Lodge guests enter through meadow gate at "MeadowFest" sign.

- ❖ **First, go to the Community Center/Red Barn, check in, and confirm your workshift.**
- ❖ Lodge guests must sign the **Red Feather Ranch Lodge/Land Use Agreement** (and please leave coolers in the barn)
- ❖ If you haven't registered in advance, register at the Community Center upon arrival if there is space available.
- ❖ Space is limited, so advanced registration is highly encouraged.

CHECK-OUT:

- ❖ Lodge guests room check-out 11 AM Sunday (extra charge if check out after 11:30 am) may stay on-site until 1 PM
- ❖ Campers check-out by 1 PM Sunday (Clean-up workshift starts at noon Sunday)
- ❖ Please fill out evaluation form and tell us what you think so we may continue to improve MeadowFest

WORKSHIFT PARTICIPATION:

- ❖ Please contribute to make this festival a success by performing one 30-60 minute workshift.
- ❖ Check the workshift sign up sheet at the Community Center. (enter your preference on the registration form).

CAMPING: DO NOT BLOCK MAIN ROAD.

- ❖ You may clear sage to make room for your tent. Make sage bundles or bring sage to the Community Center.
- ❖ Self-contained Camper vans and recreational vehicles are allowed. No hookups. No generators, please.
- ❖ Please treat the earth with great respect. This is our only home.
- ❖ We are camping in a horse pasture, so it will look like a horse pasture! Beware of GOPHER HOLES!! Watch your step!
- ❖ You are welcome to sit or play on the Lodge porch and take a tour of the Lodge. However, Lodge bathrooms have limited capacity and are for Lodge guests only.

RITUALS / ACTIVITIES:

- ❖ Thursday Eve Full Moon/Opening Ritual, Friday Noon Solstice Ritual, (Optional) Community Created Saturday Eve Ritual, Closing Ritual Sunday. Morning Earth Prayer each morning.
- ❖ Nightly Community Campfires (dusk to midnight) – Chanting and Drumming
- ❖ Community Pot Luck Meals – optional, or dine by yourself or with someone special on a nearby mountain (sans fire).
- ❖ There will be a few workshops each day. Perhaps drumming, knot tying, nature hikes ... There will be a chant time Friday and Saturday during the day. If you would like to offer a workshop, please contact Sára: (970)227-5275.

HIKING:

- ❖ You may hike the adjacent National Forest (300,000 acres available)
- ❖ Do not go on private property. Do not approach horses in neighboring pastures, or reach over the fence.
- ❖ Lions, Bears, Gray Foxes, and Badgers have been seen. Wear small bells when hiking alone so you don't surprise them.

CHILDREN:

- ❖ Children are welcome at all events. Whether your children attend events or not; keep track of your children.
- ❖ You are responsible for your children AT ALL TIMES. Do not permit children to wander unattended.
- ❖ Please volunteer to coordinate some simple pastimes for children (contact Sára: (970)227-5275)

DOGS:

- ❖ Up to 8 pre-registered well-behaved dogs are allowed. PLEASE do not show up with un-registered dogs.
- ❖ Your dog must be with you OR under control at all times. Dogs that are unable to behave will be sent home.
- ❖ The "resident dogs" are Kismet (German Shepherd) and Shiva (Rotty-Shepherd mix). They love humans as well as dogs.
- ❖ All dogs must be contained elsewhere during rituals and meals and must be happily and quietly physically contained at night.

COOKING / MEALS:

- ❖ Campers and Lodge guests' tables, stoves, and coolers will be set up in the Community Center.
- ❖ Lodge guests should use the community center to prepare meals (extra charge if you use Lodge kitchen or dishes)
- ❖ Separate vegetarian and non-vegetarian serving areas will be provided.
- ❖ Breakfast: (8 - 9 am) Pancakes and Coffee will be provided (bring fruit and toppings)
- ❖ Potluck Dinners: Thursday, Friday, Saturday (Mexican Theme).
- ❖ Dishwashing station provided Breakfast & Dinner daily (wash, rinse, sanitize)
- ❖ Please scrape plates before washing. Bring table service, napkins, chairs, tea, juice, or other drinks.
- ❖ Please bring a potluck dish of 6 or more servings for each dinner in which you participate. Please wash and remove your personal and serving dishes after each meal so the cleanup workshift may clean the kitchen area.
- ❖ This is a barn with hay, please be careful with flames.
- ❖ Please keep your food and coolers (except drinks) in the barn at night as we may have bears and other wildlife.

WATER & TOILETS: (Lodge bathrooms have limited capacity and are for Lodge guests only.)

- ❖ Bring your own drinking water. Limited well water available at the barn. Please conserve water.
- ❖ Port-O-Lets are located near the Community Center.

TRASH AND RECYCLING:

- ❖ Please pack all of your own garbage out.
- ❖ Please use the recycling bins located at the Community Center.
- ❖ Do not litter! If you see others litter, please remind them, or pick it up. Offenders will be asked to police the grounds.

FIRES:

- ❖ NO PERSONAL OPEN FIRES!! NO TIKI TORCHES OR OPEN FLAME!! NO CHARCOAL GRILLS!!
- ❖ Please use fire safety! The land is often very dry. Remember this even when cooking on camp stoves.
- ❖ There are two community camp fires. Camp Fires are tended by a designated Fire Tender. If you are not a designated Fire Tender, DO NOT touch the fire. Keep children and pets away from all open flames at all times.
- ❖ Responsible smoking away from structures (barns) is permitted. Please remove all traces of smoking including cigarette butts.
NO SMOKING IN COMMUNITY CENTER (new barn) OR OLD BARN – there is dry hay around!

HOT TUB: NO GLASS CONTAINERS IN OR WITHIN 20' OF HOT TUB – Bring a towel

- ❖ 8 Person Limit, Hot tub hours: 8 am – midnight (Potty-trained CHILDREN 10am – 6pm)
- ❖ ADULTS ONLY / CLOTHING OPTIONAL after dark

DIRECTIONS: Visit www.redfeatherranch.com for other scenic routes to Red Feather Ranch (970-881-3715)

Take Hwy. 287 North from Fort Collins past the Conoco Station (Ted's Place). Continue North on Hwy 287 for 10 miles. Turn left on Hwy. 74E (signs to Red Feather Lakes, Boy Scout Ranch Rd). Continue 16 miles. Turn left on County Rd. 68C (signs to Boy Scout Rd, Shambhala). Drive 7 miles (13 minutes or so) until you reach an intersection with mail boxes. Stay left; go over a hill 1/4 mile.

THINGS TO BRING:

- ❖ Complete camping set up---tents, pads, and sleeping bags, hiking gear---whatever you need to be comfy.
- ❖ Cool, warm and dry gear---we are in the mountains, expect any weather any time!
- ❖ Tables, chairs and camp stoves to share in the Community Center. Dishes, utensils and cups for your family.
- ❖ Sunscreen and bug repellent. Biodegradable earth-friendly soaps and other products.
- ❖ Drums, games, Frisbees, kites, dog and kid toys. Your own towel or robe for Hot tub.
